

Tresillian Village Improvement Group
12 March 2016

1. "Clean for the Queen" was a great success this morning with 22 people meeting at the Playing Field to assist with litter picking, pruning and boat washing. We collected 15 sacks of rubbish which, although a lot, seems to reduce in number each year so that's a positive. There was a certain amount of fly tipping reported in some areas of the village so if those of our helpers who discovered this can e-mail me on jandldobel@btinternet.com with a rough idea of the items and where they were found, I will inform Cornwall Council.
2. Wild flowers – after discussion regarding the success, or not, of planting wildflowers on the main road, it was agreed that Lorraine purchase perennials to see if they would be successful in providing a colourful display. It was also agreed that Cherry would purchase Cotoneaster Horizontalis as a colourful backdrop to the memorial stone in the Playing Field.
3. South West in Bloom – application has been made and the date for judging is awaited.
4. Tresillian Post Office – the Parish Council have agreed to hold a consultation in the Village Hall. Lesley to e-mail the Parish Clerk for the date which would then be passed to Keith Littlejohns to put on www.tresillianvillage.co.uk. Lesley also to ask the Parish Clerk to produce posters advertising the consultation with the Parish Council logo on top which would then be displayed in the various noticeboards around the village.
5. Commemoration of the Queen's 90th Birthday – it was felt that a cream tea held behind the Wheel Inn would be a good way for the village to commemorate this event. Lesley to liaise with Alison at the Wheel and Kay to liaise with Mrs Vicary, who will be celebrating her 90th birthday this year, to see if she would be available on Sunday 12 June when she would be invited to cut the cake. Kay will also check regarding Mrs Maycock's age.
6. Tresillian Village Website – Keith Littlejohns explained the purpose of this website and how it can be used as a village noticeboard without detracting from the purpose of TRAM. He is looking to take advertising from local businesses to help with the running costs. It was also suggested that this site could link to Facebook so that it would flag up events to users of that site.
