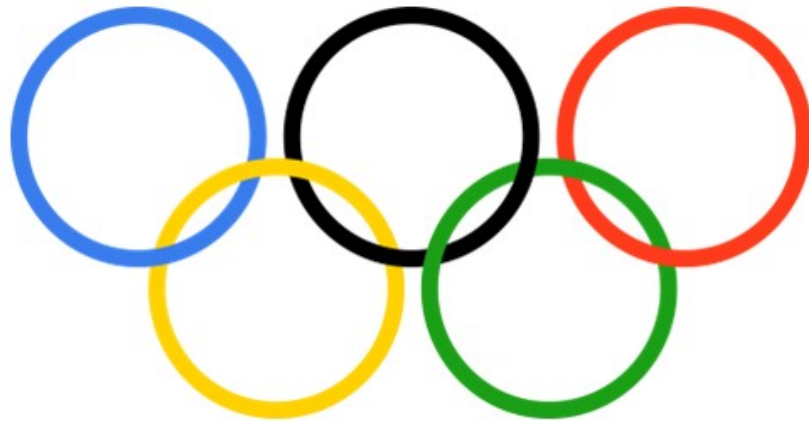

## **WORLD SMITE CHAMPIONSHIP REPORT & UPCOMING CORNISH SMITE CHAMPIONSHIPS**

The annual World Smite Championship took place in St Neot on the edge of Bodmin Moor over the August Bank Holiday weekend. Smite is a version of garden skittles and players gather from all over the country, many making this an annual pilgrimage and basing their Cornwall summer holiday around this event. There was even a handful of international competitors taking part – from as far as East Timor and New Zealand!

The reigning World Singles Champion was none other than Tresillian's very own, Isaac Nicholson! He had also won the World Doubles title with his Dad, Andrew in 2022. Isaac started his title defence in great form, winning all four games in his group to make the knock out stages, including a tense 50-48 win over a former world champion. A 2-1 win followed in a high - quality 2nd round game before a 2-0 win in the quarter finals saw him pitched up against 2022 World Singles Champion James Martin in the semi finals. Isaac easily brushed the former champion aside with a 2-0 win to set up another final – this time vs local St Neot "Smiter", Pete Parry. Pete took the opening leg, but Isaac then hit top form to win the next two to retain his World Singles title and give him a third world title in all – all before he turns eighteen! He's also the first player to retain the world singles title since Andy Cooke in 2018.

In the World Doubles Championship – 2022, winners Andrew and Isaac Nicholson were knocked out in a cracking Quarter Final by fellow father and son "Smiters", Ryland and Jack Shepherd from Probus! In the deciding leg as Jack came to the smitch, the Nicholsons were 47-41 ahead with an easy three pin on offer if Jack missed to win the game. But Jack took out a great long shot on the nine pin to win it 50-47.

They had previously lost a World semi -final in 2022 to the Nicholsons pair, as well as a couple of close defeats in the Cornish Championship, so this was a well- deserved victory.

Ryland and Jack didn't look back from this point and won their semi final 2-0 before winning the title 2-0 in the final after Ryland took out a ten pin to become world doubles champions! So, all the current Smite World Champions hail from Tresillian and Probus!

### **CORNISH SMITE CHAMPIONSHIP IN TRESILLIAN – 22ND SEPTEMBER!**

The Cornish Smite Championship takes place at 2pm on Sunday 22nd September at Tresillian Playing Field. This event used to take place in Calstock but moved to Tresillian in recent years. It's a Doubles only and it's £5 entry per pair. Proceeds will go to the Playing Field and to Compassion – an organisation that facilitates the chapel sponsoring a child in Uganda. Complete novices and hardened players are all welcome – just turn up on the day and register! Lots of cake will also be available as usual and there will also be a BBQ!

The reigning World Singles and World Doubles Champions will all be in action, plus the reigning Cornish Champions – Matt and Hannah from Troon.

To sign up, text Helen Nicholson on 07791 371933, or just turn up on the day by 2pm – individuals can also be paired up.

BACKGROUND:Smite is a version of skittles that are numbered one to ten. If a single skittle is felled the number of the pin is scored. However, if more than one pin is felled, it's the number of pins that have been felled that is scored. Each person or team takes it in turn to throw a larger wooden skittle (The“Smiter!”) at the pins. All felled pins are then replaced where they come to rest. Each team needs to score exactly 50 points to win the game. If the score of 50 is exceeded, the player goes back to 25. If either team misses the pins altogether on three consecutive throws, they automatically lose the game.

# Bird Life Tresillian and St Clement

Over the summer months, quite a few birds have visited us in our garden and on the allotments. Woodpeckers, magpies, wrens, and lots of robins, blackbirds, sparrows and a thrush as well as doves making quite a clatter when the latter land on the garden bushes. The woodpeckers like to grab either the peanuts or fat balls that we put out for them and hammer them into the tree bark for storage later on the year. Hazel nuts are pushed into our lawns by the squirrels but there seems to be a dearth of insects in the gardens.

At the beginning of September the Canada Geese came back with a vengeance, only the other day, the river seemed to be bereft of all but a few seabirds paddling around but yesterday I counted over one hundred geese settling just overlooking the Fal garage wall. 

The artists getting down to draw and paint summer flowers. Here are the artists having tea, coffee and biscuits.



New motorised blackout/fire retardant blinds and curtains for all windows and doors in the main hall and the committee room.

A paid Project Manager will be appointed to oversee all the works over the next few months.

Our next task is to source available grants to replace the current heating system to include the boiler, pipes and radiators.

# TRESILLIAN ALLOTMENTS.

For the plot holders it is the most exciting time in the allotment calendar, Harvesting! The harvest is the ultimate reward for all the care and attention that has been lavished on your plants over the last few weeks, and even if the rest of your family, friends and neighbours are groaning at not more courgettes, the allotment gardener is overjoyed at the success of the season.

This year while most non gardening or non allotment folk, are maybe fed up of the topsy turvy weather, for the green fingered amongst us, it has been an ok year. After the slow start of the cold wet Spring, and early Summer months, we have since, had sun and rain in almost equal measures, ideal growing conditions, and now the plots are all burgeoning with wonderful produce.

The 2nd early potatoes were one of the first crops to deliver, being lifted in July, this year on our plot, we decided not to plant first earlies as they seemed to struggle, so instead we planted two rows of second earlies and two rows of main crop potatoes.

The second early potato varieties were Acoustic and Jazzy and both have performed well.

We have had at least 5-6kgs of peas, and having decided to stagger the planting of the seed, we successfully had a crop that went through July and August.

We are now taking home trug fulls of Runner and French beans, along with courgettes and sweet corn.

One of the plot holders this year is having a go at growing asparagus and sweet potatoes, the rest of us look on in interest to see if these crops are successful, before maybe attempting to grow them ourselves.

This is a nice part of being on an allotment site, you meet like minded people, who are always up for a natter and willing to swop hints and tips, and inspire you to try to grow something a bit different.

Our motto is "If at first you don't succeed, try try try again" there is always another year, and sometimes it is about trying a different variety of seed that suits your plots conditions, for example on our plot, some of the old heritage seeds do better than the more fussy F1 hybrids, or simply growing the plants in a different area of your allotment, that is perhaps more sheltered will sometimes do the trick.

DID YOU KNOW that the humble leek was known in Egypt from the time of the Pharaohs and has been cultivated in Britain since the Saxon times. Leeks are a very easy crop to grow and are a good source of folic acid, potassium and vitamins.

We have at the time of writing two full plots and one half plot available to rent.

Full size plots measure approx 10 metres x 5 metres which gives 50 sq metres. The cost is 40 pound a year and includes water, each plot has it's own compost bin and we have four wheelbarrows for the use of plot holders.
